Next Generation in Philanthropy

Summer came again and boredom set in for many teenagers such as ours. Last year, our daughters, Amber and Ashley, did such a great job reporting on charities that help disadvantaged children they did another one this summer. A donation from the Turnbow Foundation will be made in their name to each of the following organizations.

Amber choose Gabriel's Angles of Mesa, Arizona. Their mission is to deliver healing pet therapy to abused, neglected and at-risk children, nurturing their ability to love and trust, thereby freeing them from the cycle of abuse. Their philosophy is that the bond between a therapy dog and child is strong enough to break the cycle of violence. Gabriel's Angles began in 2000 with one dog (Gabriel) and has now grown to nearly 70 therapy dogs who visit to sites throughout the Phoenix and Tucson areas. "This is a great way for children to know they are loved unconditionally" Amber.

Ashley choose Teen Lifeline, a Phoenix, Arizona based organization whose mission is to provide a safe, confidential and crucial crisis service where teens help teens make healthy decisions. "It is important that teens are helping other teens" says Ashley. The heart of their program is the Peer Counseling Hotline which provides troubled youth the opportunity to access immediate help from peer counselors seven days a week 365 days a year. They also offer life skills development training to those who would like to become a peer counselor; community education which provides awareness, education and prevention in the community and a peer mediation program that teaches students and faculty skills needed to mediate conflict on campus.
